Eye Contact Important

Dear Miss M.: Just as shaking hands with gloves on may be construed as an insult, an attempt to avoid intimate contact by wearing sunglasses at inappropriate times can be interpreted as rudeness. The person who wears sunglasses habitually, indoors and in cloudy weather, succeeds in conveying the impression of coolness and withdrawal. The darkened glass serves as a barrier between the wearer and the people he meets.

Social psychologist Michael Argyle reports a study in which subjects experienced the least social anxiety when speaking behind an audience. The next lowest amount was felt when wearing dark glasses. Avoiding eye contact, then, may be a way of overcoming stage fright or social anxiety in any situation.

The eyes are the focal feature of the face and serve as indicators of interest and emotions. Studies have shown that the amount of eye contact that occurs between two persons can be taken as a measure of intimacy, although women in general engage in more eye contact than men.

Evidence of Intimacy

The exchange of long, lingering glances is usually interpreted as evidence of considerable intimacy between the two persons involved.

No one feels comfortable for long under the intense stare of a stranger, but some people seem to have difficulty tolerating even a normal amount of eye contact with other persons.

The person who is unsure of himself and wary of intimacy with others may protect himself from eye contact with others by frequently averting his eyes. Most people are put off by this inability to look someone in the eye.

The assumption is that eye aversion is an expression of untrustworthiness or dishonesty. In fact, one study found that if subjects in an experiment were inducted to cheat, in later interviews they showed less eye contact than normal. Thus, avoiding eye contact may be a corollary of deception, an attempt to avoid revealing, discrediting information.

Sociologist Erving Goffman points out that sunglasses are frequently associated with celebrities, giving the message that the wearer is someone who wants to be incognito and would otherwise be recognized. It may also be that it is necessary for him to wear corrective glasses at all times and he finds it less detrimental to his self-image if the glasses are prescription sunglasses, whose purpose is less apparent.
